A. Chase Mitzryk – Green Mitten Pharms

- Would like to open a marijuana retail store within city limits at 3768 S Huron St.
 - o Currently this is not permitted within the city limits.
- Topic tabled, pending a public hearing scheduled for February 2025 City Council meeting.

B. Water Plant

- The State of Michigan is requiring Water Treatment Plants to get an additional Software to better monitor the filters within the water system.
 - o FilmTec Corporation will provide the software and install it at the water treatment plant.
 - Price Quote was \$7620.00.
- This needs to be implemented as soon as possible by state guidelines.
- Expense would come out of the water fund.

D. Steel Building – Main Lift Station

- The new lift installed at the lift station was presented as not needing a building around it to protect it from the elements.

 - o It is believed that we do not need heat to prevent the machine from freezing just something to block from the wind.
- A small building quote from local business was \$6259.00.
 - There are a few businesses that sell these types of buildings, and the council would like to get quotes from a few additional locations.

MOVED by Fleszar and supported by Link to move forward with getting additional quotes on a building and giving the City Manager approval to purchase a building for the Main Lift Station that does not exceed the amount of \$6,259.

 - o It has been determined that as of January 13, 2025, individuals are still residing on this property in a Camper A certified letter will be mailed to the property owner issuing a fine for the violations.
